

We're Getting AHEAD of HIV.

What is AHEAD?

America's HIV Epidemic Analysis Dashboard (AHEAD) is a data visualization tool that displays data on the six EHE indicators: incidence, knowledge of status, diagnoses, linkage to HIV medical care, viral suppression, and PrEP coverage.

Located on HIV.gov, AHEAD gives national, state, and local stakeholders the ability to monitor progress towards meeting the goals of the *Ending the HIV Epidemic: A Plan for America* (EHE) initiative.

AHEAD was developed by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) through its Office of Infectious Disease and HIV/AIDS Policy (OIDP) in collaboration with the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health (OASH), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), Indian Health Service (IHS), National Institutes of Health (NIH), Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services (SAMHSA), and Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

WHO CAN USE AHEAD?

AHEAD is one element of a society-wide effort. Local jurisdictions can monitor progress towards indicator goals and access tools to understand the HIV epidemic through systematic comparisons and analyses. Public health officials, HIV advocates, researchers, healthcare professionals, people living with HIV, and people impacted by HIV can also use AHEAD to track EHE progress in their communities.

AMPLIFYING THE EHE MISSION

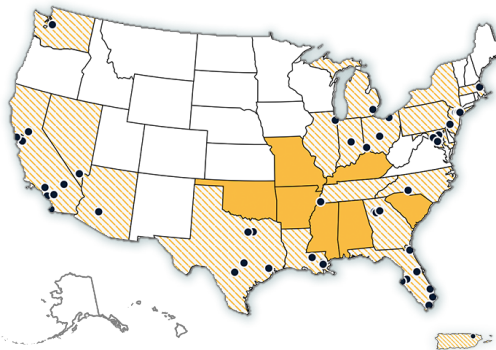
AHEAD is one of two large-scale OIDP programs working to end the HIV epidemic in America. While Ready, Set, PrEP focuses on providing HIV medications at no cost to eligible individuals, AHEAD focuses on data transparency and progress. This site empowers local stakeholders to track movement towards the goals of the EHE initiative and focus additional expertise, technology, and resources required to tailor and implement successful interventions.

STAY UPDATED ON AHEAD

JURISDICTIONS

AHEAD focuses on locations identified by phase I of the EHE initiative: 48 counties, Washington, D.C., and San Juan, Puerto Rico, where more than 50% of new HIV diagnoses occurred in 2016 and 2017, and an additional 7 states with a substantial burden of HIV in rural areas, bringing the total number of phase I jurisdictions to 57.
